From the Deacon

B rothers and Sisters in Christ, our journey together continues. We began this journey some months ago, and we had no idea where the Lord was going to take us. In the beginning, we simply had to get to know one another, but the time rolled on. God pointed us in the same direction.

Over the summer, we held a joyful Vacation Bible School. We began a food ministry, and what a success it has become. This ministry has opened doors to our local community where we have blessed many families with our giving. What we must keep in mind is that we are truly the ones that have been blessed. I presented you with a new challenge, and that was backpacks with the needed school supplies for children in Canastota that could otherwise not afford them. In one week, our small country church provided 12 complete backpacks. Mary Jean, the director of the Opportunity Shop, was overwhelmed with our generosity and giving.

As I said in our August Voters Meeting, while we should feel blessed and feel good about our efforts, we must remember that our community outreach has only just

begun. Over the fall and winter, I would like to begin a Family Night. This is so the families in our area that can't otherwise afford a night at the movies or some other type of entertainment will have a place to go and know that this family at Grace is here to help in whatever way we can.

This fall we will begin Confirmation Classes for three of our young adults. This will be their first year of study and will prepare them for their life in the church, and with God as the center of their lives. I ask each of you to find your Small Catechism and simply read it. Let the material flow from your mind and retouch your heart.

I know I tell everyone that we must look forward, and we must. However, as we go forward, we must remember the beginnings of Grace. My wife and I are what you might call newcomers, but the other day when I was here visiting members of the congregation at the hospital and the nursing home, I noticed the explanation of the Four Hands. I would like all of you to take just a moment and re-read this statement:

Grace Lutheran Church is people, ordinary and average people, no different from any other group of people with <u>ONE</u> exception—the reason for our gathering together, which is Christ Jesus.

Our focus for existence is the Lord and His Holy Cross. Let us explain with real terms-human hands like your own.

1. The Nail-Pierced Hand

The Almighty God came as a man, the second Adam, to suffer for all mankind. Our loving and compassionate Creator Who hates wrong, evil, sin, became Himself the payment for all people's debt of selfish stupidity. He, Christ Jesus, also true God, allowed Himself to be nailed to the Cross of shame for us all. With His nail torn hands <u>He proclaimed His love for all</u>. Human words are cheap today. His divine life is worth our eternity. Our debt is paid in full! The nail-pierced hand is also the hand of resurrection!

2. The Blessing Hand

We received that good, <u>Good News</u>, <u>The GOSPEL</u>, and we now proclaim its happy truth, passing on and sharing the Good News with everyone else. The oneness we have with our loving Lord is the unity we have with others as we share Jesus, the Christ. In humbly representing Jesus we are and can be a blessing to all.

3. The Up-Stretched Hand

In reaching above and beyond ourselves we state boldly we cannot live life nor have peace in ourselves. We cannot "do it ourselves" but need help, and yes, salvation, from the Lord. p

We surrender without fear our very existence to Him.

4. The Caring Hand

Our Lord Jesus lovingly provides for us in body, mind, and spirit. We have the vast abundance of His and life's goodness. We



are not to selfishly think we possess these blessings only for ourselves. In response to Him we say with all our being, THANK YOU!

Jesus does not need our possessions. He is their source! We are to pass them on to others, familiar and those unfamiliar. Our thanksgiving becomes joyous <u>thanks-</u> <u>living</u>!

In growing faith in our Savior, we serve with joyful praise and willing sacrifice. We honestly <u>give of ourselves</u>, just as we are and come to know that <u>Jesus accepts us</u>, just as we are. We also can accept ourselves, not only as redeemed sinners, but as fellow servants with Christ Jesus, and we rejoice in that! In Him!

When you read this statement that Pastor O'Connor wrote many years ago, it still reminds us of why we are here.

I try not to make these articles overly long and wordy, but this week, as I prepared this article, my mind and my heart kept going back to our members that are being cared for either at the nursing home or in the hospital. Two weeks ago, in my sermon, I told you not to worry, but to simply trust in the Lord. This week, our brother Paul Clark was taken home to be with Jesus. While our hearts are saddened by his passing, Paul would tell you "don't be sad, rejoice for I am in heaven with my Lord."

Many years ago a Pastor that was instrumental in my life read us this statement:

"When we face difficult or challenging situations, we can crumble into our weakness or we can choose to trust God. He has already promised us that he is with us at all times. He will never leave us alone. Now it is up to us to take him at his word. If we trust him day by day, he will give us the strength and courage we need to face whatever comes our way. Wherever we go, we can tap into that strength and courage and we can do anything. It is his power that flows through us with every step that we take."

Consider the Lilies of the Field

The Gospel lesson for August 11, 2013, was Luke 12:22–24. I have had that lesson on my mind since. It really got me thinking about how silly human beings are. We seem to think that we need to be in control of everything — even our worries. In our hearts, we know The One Who is all-powerful is the One in Whom we need to trust.

The Gospel begins as Jesus is speaking to His disciples who were famous worriers. He says, "do not be anxious". In other words, don't worry.

They worried about where their next meal was coming from and what clothes they would need, where they would lay their heads, they worried about everything.

He points out how the lilies of the field grow, neither by toil nor spin yet even Solomon in his glory is not arrayed as lovely, and that the One who loves us more than anything else will continue to care for our needs.

He reminds them that no matter how much they worry, they cannot add even a single moment to their lives! Guess what? That's us!

What a revelation! Is He serious? No matter how much I worry? Wow! Then why do I continue to worry? I believe I have the answer! Could it be?

We just need to stop worrying, share our faith, and let it happen.
